The PMFME – Food Tech Kerala 2025 Exhibition, a flagship initiative under the Pradhan Mantri Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme, was successfully held from May 22 to 24, 2025 at the Jawaharlal Nehru International Stadium Ground, Kaloor, Kochi. 
The Hon. Minister for Law, Industries and Coir, Shri P. Rajeeve, officially inaugurated the PMFME – Food Tech Kerala 2025 exhibition at the Jawaharlal Nehru International Stadium Ground, Kallur on 2025 May 22. The inaugural function will also feature key dignitaries and stakeholders from the government, banking, and food processing sectors.

In his keynote address, the Hon. Minister lauded Kerala's outstanding performance under the Pradhan Mantri Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme, noting that the State had exceeded the targets set by the Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Government of India for the financial years 2023–24 and 2024–25.

Hon. Minister highlighted that Kerala now ranks first in the country in terms of business friendliness and PMFME scheme performance, a remarkable leap from its 12th position just three years ago, achieving a 104% growth. The Minister emphasized the pivotal role of the food processing sector in Kerala's economic development and credited the robust growth of MSME lending and enterprise support for accelerating the State's industrial progress.

During the event, the Hon. Minister also launched a dedicated PMFME helpline (9747022883), aimed at providing accurate information and clarifying queries related to the scheme, thereby enhancing accessibility and transparency for prospective beneficiaries.

The PMFME – Food Tech Kerala 2025 Exhibition was organized with the dual objective of offering marketing support to PMFME beneficiaries and raising public awareness about the scope and impact of the scheme. The exhibition showcased a wide array of



value-added food products and cutting-edge processing technologies from across Kerala.

As part of the inaugural function, the Hon. Minister felicitated top-performing Banks, District Industries Centres (DICs), and District Resource Persons (DRPs) for their exemplary efforts in the successful processing and completion of loan applications and overall implementation of the PMFME Scheme in the State.

Hon'ble Minister for Law, Industries and Coir, Shri P. Rajeev, announced that Kerala has exceeded the targets set by the Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI), Government of India, under the PMFME (Pradhan Mantri Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises) scheme for both the financial years 2023–24 and 2024–25. 

The helpline, accessible via the number 9747022883, is designed to serve as a crucial resource for micro food processing enterprises in Kerala, providing them with essential information and a direct channel to resolve their queries related to the scheme.





Purpose and Significance of the Helpline: This dedicated helpline highlighted the Department of Industries and Commerce's strong commitment to ensuring the smooth and effective implementation of the PMFME scheme at the grassroots level. Its primary purposes are:

1. Information Dissemination: To provide readily available and accurate information about various aspects of the PMFME scheme, including eligibility criteria, application procedures, required documentation, available subsidies, and support services. This helps potential and existing beneficiaries understand the scheme better.

2. Query Resolution: To offer a direct point of contact for entrepreneurs to address any doubts, challenges, or issues they might encounter during the application process or while availing benefits under the scheme. This proactive approach aims to minimize bureaucratic hurdles and delays.

Benefits for Micro Food Processing Enterprises: The launch of this helpline is expected to bring several tangible benefits to the micro food processing sector in Kerala:

- **Problem Solving:** It provides a mechanism for real-time problem-solving, ensuring that enterprises can overcome obstacles efficiently and continue their growth trajectory.
- **Government-Citizen Interface:** The helpline strengthens the interface between the government and the entrepreneurs, demonstrating a responsive and supportive administration.

Exhibition Overview

The exhibition, which was the state's premier showcase of food processing and packaging technology, featured 104 stalls under the Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) scheme. These stalls displayed a diverse range of innovative products and services from Kerala's own food processing entrepreneurs. The diversity on display in the exhibition reflected Kerala's rich food heritage, including spices, pickles, traditional snacks, seafood products, ready-to-eat coconut chips, and nutritional packs manufactured from regional produce. Ripe mango pickle and mushroom pickles were among the standout products.

In addition to the beneficiary exhibits, the event prominently featured an extensive showcase of state-of-the-art food processing technologies and equipment. These included machinery and tools pertinent to various stages of the food production value chain such as:

- **Food packaging solutions** tailored for efficiency, sustainability, and extended shelf life.
- **Labeling and branding** equipment designed to enhance product presentation and marketability.
- **Dehydration and drying machinery** critical for preserving food quality and reducing waste.
- **Cooling and freezing systems** intended for maintaining product freshness and safety.
- **Automated packing machinery** that enables hygienic, rapid, and cost-effective processing.



Exhibition Details

The exhibition was meticulously curated to ensure that all essential technologies relevant to small- and micro-scale food processors were available for demonstration and interaction. Attendees had the opportunity to observe live demonstrations, consulted with technical experts, and gained insights into the practical application of emerging technologies.

Importantly, Food Tech Kerala 2025 also functioned as a robust B2B networking platform, fostering connections between food processing entrepreneurs and key industry stakeholders including suppliers, technology developers, institutional buyers, and policymakers. This dynamic interface supported knowledge exchange and partnership development, reinforcing the state's commitment to building a resilient and innovation-driven food processing sector.

Technical Sessions

As part of the PMFME FoodTech Kerala 2025 exhibition, a series of technical sessions were conducted on May 22, 2025, at the Kaloor International Stadium, Cochin. These sessions formed a key component of the event, which was organized in alignment with the Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) scheme, with the primary objective of fostering the development and formalization of Kerala's micro food processing sector..

The technical sessions, were meticulously structured to offer valuable insights and practical knowledge to attendees, primarily micro food processing entrepreneurs.

The Session began promptly with a Welcome Address delivered by Shri. Suraj S., CEO of K-BIP. Following the welcome, Dr. K. P. Sudheer, a distinguished Professor and Head of the Department of Agricultural Engineering at Kerala Agricultural University, Thrissur, presented on “Fostering Food Processing Enterprises through PMFME Scheme.” This session was undoubtedly a cornerstone of the day’s agenda, directly addressing the core theme of the exhibition. detailing how the scheme supports and develops enterprises.

The program then transitioned into a more specialized technological focus with a session on the “Advantages of 2PC Can Technology in Packaging for Processed Marine & Agro Products.” This presentation was delivered by Mr. Robert Gary and Mr. Mohan Kuruvilla of Stolle Machinery, USA. The discussion likely delved into the efficiencies, sustainability, and quality benefits of 2-Piece Can technology, particularly for the preservation and marketability of Kerala’s significant marine and agricultural produce.

Concluding the afternoon’s technical agenda, Mr. Vineeth Kinarath, Assistant General Manager-Operations at CARE Keralam, spoke on “Services offered for Health Supplements & Nutraceuticals manufacturing Entrepreneurs.” This session addressed a burgeoning and high-value segment of the food processing industry. Mr. Kinarath’s expertise from CARE Keralam would have provided crucial information on the specialized support, regulatory requirements, and operational services available to entrepreneurs venturing into or expanding within the health supplements and nutraceuticals manufacturing space.

The technical sessions on May 22, 2025, were curated to deliver a balanced mix of policy insight, technological innovation, and market-specific expertise. The involvement of esteemed speakers from academic, governmental, and industrial backgrounds ensured a holistic and enriching experience for participants. These sessions successfully fulfilled the broader objective of the PMFME FoodTech Kerala 2025 event—to educate, empower, and enable micro food processing entrepreneurs, ultimately contributing to the sustained growth and formalization of the sector in Kerala.



Kerala Excels in PMFME Scheme for Second Year Running

Kerala has once again emerged as a top-performing state in the implementation of the Pradhan Mantri Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme, reflecting a high level of administrative efficiency, strategic execution, and institutional coordination. For the Financial Year 2024–25, the State achieved 104% of its assigned target, sanctioning 3,116 loan applications against the Ministry of Food Processing Industries' (MoFPI) target of 3,000.

The PMFME Scheme, an initiative of MoFPI, Government of India, provides a credit-linked capital subsidy of up to 35% to support micro food processing enterprises. Kerala's performance in FY 2024–25 builds on its success in the previous year. In FY 2023–24, the State sanctioned 2,577 loans against a target of 2,526, achieving 102% of the goal and securing third place nationally in the credit-linked subsidy category.

This consistent overachievement underscores Kerala's commitment to fostering entrepreneurship and supporting the formalization of micro enterprises. Thousands of beneficiaries, ranging from traditional food producers to emerging food tech entrepreneurs, are now better equipped to expand operations, enhance productivity, and contribute to inclusive economic growth.

Implementation of PMFME Scheme in Kerala

Government of Kerala has nominated Industries Department as the Nodal Department and Kerala Bureau of Industrial Promotion (KBIP) as the State Nodal Agency for the implementation of PM FME scheme in the State and is also functioning as the SPMU of the State.

Vide G.O. (Rt) No.589/2020/ID dated 06/08/2020 has constituted a State Level Approval Committee (SLAC) chaired by the Chief Secretary and a District Level Committee (DLC) chaired by District Collector.

The Director of Industries & Commerce is the Nodal Officer of the PMFME Scheme in Kerala. The District Industries Centres (DICs) under the Directorate of Industries & Commerce is functioning as the District Nodal Points to facilitate the Micro Food Processing Enterprises. A Nodal Officer is nominated in each District Industries Centre for collecting and processing applications received from individual micro enterprises, Farmer Product Organisations (FPOs) / Producers Cooperatives from their



respective District to avail the benefits of the Scheme and District Resource Persons (DRPs) are engaged in 14 Districts for providing handholding support to the beneficiaries at the District/Regional level for PM FME Scheme. These DRPs provide handholding support to the beneficiaries, preparation of DPR, taking Bank Loan, support for obtaining necessary registration and licenses including FSSI, Udyog Aadhaar, GST, etc.

Kerala Agricultural University (KAU) is the State Level Technical Institute (SLTI) is undertaking the Capacity Building Programmes for PM FME scheme in the State. The Applications for disbursement of Seed Capital is being collected by the Kudumbashree Mission (State Rural Livelihood Mission) from SHGs engaged in Food Processing.
